Minutes

Members Present: Chairman Owen, Justices Dixon, Reagan, Young, Hunter, and Braziel  
Members Absent: Vice- Chairman McGrew

Also Present: Citizens, Elected Officials, Staff, and Media

Chairman Owen called the meeting to order and introduced Ordinance O19-40, an ordinance to amend Ordinance O-91-22, to regulate off-premises signs along scenic roadways. Chairman Owen asked County Attorney Howard to explain the intent. It is to prevent the new section from having signs placed on it. A motion for do pass was made by Justice Reagan and seconded by Justice Dixon. Chairman Owen asked for questions or discussion, with none the motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Owen introduced Ordinance O19-39 an ordinance to amend Ordinance O-10-62, regarding the service fees charged for the collection of Solid Waste. A motion for do pass was made by Justice Braziel and seconded by Justice Reagan. Chairman Owen asked for questions or discussion, with none the motion passed without opposition. Attorney Howard stated that an emergency clause had been added to Ordinance O-19-39. Chairman Owen explained that the emergency clause would require a 2/3 vote to pass.

Chairman Owen called the meeting to order and introduced Resolution R-19-19 a resolution confirming the appointment of Gregory Pattillo to the Lake Catherine Waterworks and Sewer Facilities Board. A motion for do pass was made by Justice Braziel and seconded by Justice Young. Chairman Owen asked for questions or discussion, with none the motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Owen introduced Ordinance O19-41, an ordinance to amend Ordinance O-16-06 regarding the uniform system for numbering buildings and street frontage, naming streets, numbering lakefront property, providing the methods for instituting said system, for the enforcement. Chairman Owen asked Attorney Howard to explain the ordinance, and he indicated that to get a new address, you would have to comply with other county ordinances. A motion for do pass was made by Justice Braziel and seconded by Justice Reagan. Chairman Owen asked for questions or discussion, with none the motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Owen introduced Ordinance O19-42 an ordinance to amend Ordinance O-08-08, regarding creating a property code for Hot Springs Village. Chairman Owen asked Attorney Howard to explain the ordinance, and he indicated this is at the request of Justice Raney and was a mirror of the Saline County ordinance to allow a designee instead of a specific person to be the compliance officer. A motion for do pass was made by Justice Young and seconded by Justice Dixon. Chairman Owen asked for questions or discussion; Justice Young asked if this was a county employee, and Attorney Howard indicated it was not. With nothing further, the motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Owen introduced Ordinance O19-43 an ordinance to amend the 2019 budget Ordinance O-18-56 and un-appropriate funds from the General Fund, and appropriate funds in the Court Cost Division IV Fund to pay a part-time Bailiff. A motion for do pass was made by Justice Dixon and seconded by Justice Braziel. Chairman Owen asked for questions or discussion, with none the motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Owen introduced Ordinance O19-44, an ordinance to amend the 2019 budget Ordinance O-18-56, to anticipate revenue, and appropriate funds in various budgets.

- a. Drug Task Force grant appropriation of \$27,549.58 to pay for an investigator's salary and benefits.
- b. Victim of Crimes Act grant appropriation of \$16,081.29 to pay for administrator salaries and benefits.
- c. State Homeland Security grant program appropriation and transfer of \$146,905.42 to pay back the Ouachita Memorial Hospital Sale Fund and close out the remainder of the funds to the General Fund.
- d. Division I Circuit Court requested an appropriation for \$75 that was reimbursed to the court for a drug test.

A motion for do pass was made by Justice Reagan and seconded by Justice Dixon. Chairman Owen asked for questions or discussion, with none the motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Owen introduced Ordinance O19-45, an ordinance to amend the 2019 budget Ordinance O-18-56, to anticipate revenue, and appropriate funds in various Sheriff's budgets.

- a. The Sheriff deposited \$7,925.69 for two months of National School Lunch reimbursements and insurance proceeds for the Juvenile Detention and the Sheriff's budget in the General Fund.
- b. The Sheriff deposited \$21,224.78 in the Detention Facility from the Sheriff's Communication fund for a portion of commissions received on commissary and telephone sales in the third quarter.

A motion for do pass was made by Justice Dixon and seconded by Justice Braziel. Chairman Owen asked for questions or discussion, with none the motion passed without opposition.
