

ORDINANCE NO. O-21-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF GARLAND COUNTY, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

“AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY, BY AND THROUGH THE COUNTY JUDGE, TO CONTINUE TO DO BUSINESS WITH C. J. HORNER INCORPORATED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

WHEREAS, John Horner has been elected to a two-year term as Justice of the Peace for District 5 in Garland County; and,

WHEREAS, Garland County has done business in the past and wants to continue to do business with C.J. Horner, Inc.; and,

WHEREAS, John Horner is one of the owners and operators of C. J. Horner, Inc.; and,

WHEREAS, the provisions of this ordinance are intended to be in compliance with Ark. Code Ann. 14-14-1202; and

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court has concluded that it is in the best interest of the County to continue to do business with C.J. Horner, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, unusual circumstances exist as C.J. Horner Inc., provides unique products, long term experience, and specialized advice on products, materials, and services; and,

WHEREAS, the business relationship between the County and C.J. Horner, Inc., shall be limited to that which is reasonably necessary; and,


WHEREAS, this ordinance shall be approved by at least a 2/3 majority vote of the Quorum Court or it shall be ineffective; and,


WHEREAS, John Horner shall not vote on the approval of this ordinance or any purchases that may be considered under the authority of this ordinance; and,


WHEREAS, the Finance Committee has previously met and approved this request.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF GARLAND COUNTY, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. That the Quorum Court of Garland County, Arkansas hereby declares that it is in the best interest of the County to continue to do business with C. J. Horner, Inc.. pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. 14-14-1202.
